Professional & Community Education

Stewards of Children (Child Sexual Abuse)

Stewards of Children teaches adults how to prevent, recognize, and react responsibly to child sexual abuse. It is the only nationally distributed, evidence based program proven to increase knowledge, improve attitudes, and change child protective behaviors. Length: 120 minutes

Sexual Assault

Participants will learn the definitions of sexual assault, rape, and the laws of consent. Discussion topics include myths and facts, intervention tips, and what to do if sexual assault occurs. Length: 60 – 120 minutes

Advanced Sexual Assault Dynamics

MOCSA educators facilitate an in-depth examination of sexual violence, short and long term effects, community engagement, and the role of advocates and community responders. Length: 60 – 120 minutes

Bystander Engagement & Responding to Victims

Participants will learn about the importance and power of bystanders in situations that lead to sexual violence including child sexual abuse, drug facilitated rape, and intimate partner sexual violence. Intervention strategies, victim support, and reporting abuse will be discussed. Length: 60 – 90 minutes

Trauma Informed Response

Attendees will gain an advanced awareness of the ways trauma impacts survivors and best practices for trauma informed response. Discussion topics include physiological responses to trauma, the impact of trauma on an investigation and how to provide a comprehensive response to sexual violence. Length: 60 – 120 minutes

Mapping Individual Solutions to Trauma (MIST)

Participants will develop an understanding of trauma and how it impacts both survivors and professionals in their daily lives. Each participant will learn self-care strategies designed for success at home, in school and the workplace. Length: 90 – 180 minutes

Film Screenings

MOCSA's Educational Film Library offers a variety of options for in-depth classroom discussion focusing on sexual assault, gender, and relationships.

Men in the Movement

This presentation examines the roles that men can have in preventing sexual violence. By discussing sexual violence as men's issue, participants will gain in depth knowledge about sexual violence and prevention. Length: 45 – 60 minutes

Introduction to Title IX

Attendees will learn the basics of Title IX and federal campus safety regulations regarding sexual violence. Information and statistics about sexual assault, trauma response, and local resources will be shared. Length: 60 – 120 minutes

Military Sexual Assault Survivors and Advocacy

This presentation offers an introduction to military culture, differences between civilian and military advocacy response, reporting options, and resources for military personnel and their families. Length: 90 minutes

Safety Planning with Persons with Disabilities

This course is designed to enhance safety planning for domestic and sexual violence survivors with disabilities. Participants will learn the unique dynamics of domestic and sexual violence experienced by survivors with disabilities, the values of safety planning, and strategies for safety planning. Length: 3 hours

Commercial Sexual Exploitation

Kansas City is a thoroughfare for victims of trafficking. In this presentation participants will learn the definition of commercial sexual exploitation, its prevalence, and how to intervene with potential victims. Length: 60 – 90 minutes

Media, Sex, & Violence

Participants examine popular media and critically examine the gender messages, target audience, and its impact on violence and relationships. Further discussion will focus on how to facilitate media conversations with youth. Length: 45 – 60 minutes

Clinical Training

Advanced training for clinical teams and counselors is available on a limited basis and can be designed to fit the needs of your group. Topics may include; Children with Sexual Behavior Problems, Treatment for Children used in the Production of Pornography, and Treatment for Children who have been Sexually Abused.
