

What might a predator do to get to know you?

- He or she might lie.
- He or she may tell you that they love you.
- He or she might try to meet you. Keep yourself safe: don't meet **anyone** you don't know.

How can you keep yourself safe on the internet?

- Never give out your **address, phone number, age, date of birth, full name** or information about your **school** (including **school name** and **mascot**).
- Always report suspicious activity to a trusted adult.
- Make sure to set the privacy controls on your social media websites so people that you don't know can't see your information.
- Feel free to block people who are harassing you on the internet!

What about sexting?

- Sexting is sending sexual pictures or words through texting or social media websites (Facebook, Twitter, etc).
- Sexting is illegal for anyone under the age of 18. Taking sexual pictures of someone under the age of 18 is considered **child pornography**, *even if* the person taking the picture is a minor, and can result in **serious consequences!!**
- If someone sends you a sexual picture, don't delete. Make sure to immediately report it to a trusted adult.
- Forwarding or not reporting a sexual picture can result in **YOU** also getting in trouble.
