

Sexual Harassment: any unwanted behavior of a sexual nature

Types of Sexual Harassment

Physical

- Unwanted touching
- Pantsing someone
- Sexual advances

Non-Verbal

- Gestures
- Checking someone out
- Staring

Verbal

- Name calling (such as the words “gay” and “slut”)
- Jokes
- Rumors

Written

- Graffiti
- Notes
- Inappropriate pictures/drawings

Remember, sexual harassment is not flirting. If it makes you feel uncomfortable or is unwanted, it's not okay! Sexual harassment can happen to anyone, by anyone, regardless of gender or age.

What about Sexting?

- Sexting is sending pictures or words of a sexual nature through texting or social media websites (Facebook, Twitter, etc).
- Sexting is illegal for anyone under the age of 18. Taking sexual pictures of someone that is under the age of 18 is considered **child pornography**, *even if* the person taking the picture is a minor, and can result in **serious consequences!!**
- If someone sends you a sexual picture, don't delete it! Make sure to immediately report it to a trusted adult.
- Forwarding or not reporting a sexual picture can result in **YOU** also getting in trouble. Report inappropriate activity **immediately!**
