Do you have Missouri tax liability?

You may be eligible for a Missouri tax credit for your MOCSA sponsorship or donation! MOCSA has Missouri DV and Rape Crisis Center Tax Credits for up to 70% of your gift.

What exactly is a tax credit?

A tax credit is subtracted from the total amount you owe to the state. It doesn't reduce your taxable income like a deduction and exemption, but directly reduces the taxes you owe.

How does it work?

For example, if you sponsor the Community Luncheon at \$10,000, then \$9,200 (the tax-deductible value) could qualify and you would receive a 70% (\$6,440) tax credit!

Jodi Kantor, Keynote Speaker

Jodi Kantor is a Pulitzer Prize-winning investigative reporter and best-selling author whose work has revealed hidden truths about power, gender, technology, politics and culture.

In October of 2017, she and Megan Twohey broke the story of Harvey Weinstein's decades of sexual abuse allegations. Their work helped ignite the #MeToo movement, shift attitudes, and spur new laws, policies and standards of accountability around the globe. Together with a team of colleagues who exposed harassment across industries, they were awarded the Pulitzer Prize for Public Service, journalism's highest award.

Kantor and Twohey built on their initial investigation on Weinstein and sexual harassment in a New York Times best-selling book entitled *She Said: Breaking the Sexual Harassment Story That Helped Ignite a Movement*, published on September 10, 2019 by Penguin Press.

It was adapted into a film by Plan B Entertainment, the makers of *Selma* and *Moonlight*. Kantor and Twohey also adapted *She Said* into *Chasing the Truth: A Young Journalist's Guide to Investigative Reporting*. The book pulls young readers into the Harvey Weinstein investigation and share the duo's investigative process and journalistic practices. *Chasing the Truth* was released November 2021.

Before digging into the Harvey Weinstein investigation, Kantor's reporting created waves across other fields. Her inquiry into Starbucks' usage of automated scheduling systems revealed widespread detriment to workers. Kantor's journalism spurred company-wide changes and helped launch a national fair scheduling movement. Following her and David Streitfeld's investigation into punishing practices at Amazon's corporate headquarters, Amazon changed its human resources policies by introducing paternity leave and eliminating its employee ranking system. Kantor's article detailing Harvard Business School's attempt to change its climate for women provoked a national conversation about women in business schools. Additionally, her report on working mothers and breastfeeding inspired two readers to create the first free-standing lactation suites for nursing mothers; the innovation is now available in hundreds of airports and stadiums.

Kantor, a contributor to *CBS This Morning*, lives in Brooklyn with her husband, Ron Lieber, and their two daughters.
